



NOTES FROM THE FIELD

Lent is a pilgrimage. We are on a journey in this season. We travel from ashes to an empty tomb and along the way we attend to the care of our spiritual lives.

Katherine's kindergarten teacher had a sign in her classroom that read, *Education is a journey, not a race*. I think the same could be said about Lent. This season is not about how fast we arrive at Easter day or who gets to the tomb first. It's a time to consider what God is doing in us, and through us, and with us, on the way.

Journeys have three parts: a beginning, a destination, and a route. So it is with our Lenten journey.

Our Lenten journey begins with ashes as we are confronted with our mortality. Ashes are like the dust of the earth. We were made from the dust and we return to the dust. Most life is measured by decades, and we are here for a little while. We came after others had been here and gone, and others will follow after us too.

Our Lenten begins with the ashes of our mortality and the frailty of human life. In a world so full of war, disease, addiction, illness,

poverty, and much more, ashes are the visible sign of human frailty – and it is where we begin our Lenten journey.

Journeys also have an end. We can't do thing called life on our own. When we try we get caught up in our own self-worth or power or mistakes or poor judgment. God knows this to be true,



and has come in person to mend in us what is broken and show us a more excellent way. God wills to rescue us from what we can't mend on our own, and so in Christ we are made whole. That is the triumphant news of Easter Day, and that's where we're heading in forty days' time.

The third part of a journey is the route. It is the way we travel from the ashes of our mortality to the mending we so long for from God in Christ? What route do we take on this Lenten journey?

We take the route of Isaiah 58, and we do not hold back (Isaiah's words). We travel the way of humility – an Isaiah 58 kind of humility. We loose the bonds of injustice. We share our bread (*and peanut butter!*) with the hungry. We help the poor. We clothe people.

In other words, in a world so driven by seeking personal gain, great wealth, and instant self-fame, we fast from all of that and look after another. This is the Lenten way of humility – and in looking after another we see up close how truly frail we are. We see how much each of us needs to reach this triumphant Lenten destination.

Isaiah 58 reads: Then the light shall break forth like the dawn. Then the Lord will guide you continually. Then your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt, and you shall be called a repairer of the breach, a restorer of street to live in.

Do you hear the power of this Lenten route we walk? It's the way of mercy, of care for another, of self-sacrifice. Look down to the pathway. Do you see a set of footsteps going forward ahead of us leading the way?

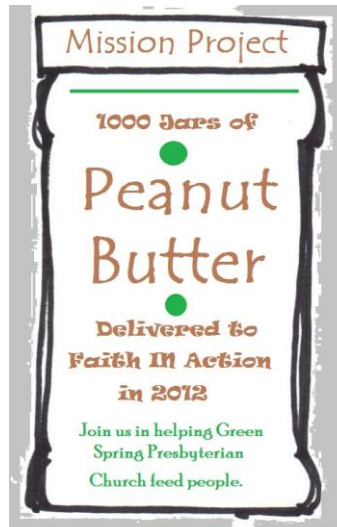
